The title font “Helvetica Bold” with a font size of 12pt. Author, Affiliations, Corresponding author, and References field headers are “Helvetica Bold” and 11pt. Author, Affiliations, Corresponding Author, and References field text are the same font as the main text. The title section is indented by 2.5cm in addition to the margin. Maintain one line of whitespace between the subheadings of the title section, and two lines of whitespace between the title section and the abstract main text. Leave one line of whitespace between the main abstract text and the references. Please submit the abstract as a PDF file.

All new paragraphs should be indented by 5mm, with no additional spacing between paragraphs. Please restrict yourself to a maximum of three hundred words. The abstract, titles and references should fit on a single page. If more pages are submitted, only the first page is printed. Indicate the corresponding author with an asterisk (*). Authors are separated by commas and put on a single line. Use numbers in parentheses to indicate affiliation. Affiliations are put on a separate line each, with enumeration in front. Do not remove the asterisk in front of the corresponding author’s email address. Please put the email address of the corresponding author in the affiliation.
